Orchard Park Fire District Resolution of the Board of Fire Commissioners

In the matter of approving the 2023 certified points

WHEREAS, the Fire District is the sponsor of a Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP) on behalf of the Orchard Park Fire Department in accordance with Article 11-A of the New York State General Municipal Lae (GML);

WHEREAS, as required by GMS §219-a(2)©, the Orchard Park Fire Department has submitted the attached list, certified under oath, of active members of the Fire Department, indicating those volunteers who earn at least fifty (50) points during 2023 to qualify for service credit;

WHEREAS, the certification made by the Fire Department includes a statement that the points recorded on the attached list have been tabulated in accordance with the Point System adopted by the Fire District to be in effect during calendar year 2023, and the best of the knowledge of the Fire Department, is a true and accurate reflection of the activities performed the active members;

WHEREAS, GML § 219-a(2)(d) requires the Board of Fire Commissioners (Board) to review and approve the attached list then return it to the Fire Department to be posted for thirty (30) days; and

WHEREAS, the board has completed its review of the attached list of volunteer firefighters of the Orchard Park Fire Department and the points earned by these firefighters during calendar year 2023; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Fire Commissioners approves the attached list of volunteer firefighters of the Orchard Park Fire Department and the points earned by these firefighters during calendar year 2023; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this adopted resolution and the attached list shall be returned to the Fire Department for posting for a minimum of thirty (30) days.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORZE EXEMPTION FOR PROPERTY TAX

Real Property Tax Law §466-a authorizes the Orchard Park Fire District to partially exempt up to 10% of the assessed value of the residence of a volunteer firefighter.

After a public hearing, the Orchard Park Fire District may adopt a Resolution authorizing the exemption.

The exemption is available only to members of the District who have been certified as being enrolled members for a minimum of two years.

An enrolled member who as accrued more than 20 years of active service may be granted an exemption for the remainder of their life as long as their primary residence is located within the Orchard Park Fire District.

The exemption may be continued or reinstated for the un-remarried spouse of a member killed in the line of duty who had been a member for at five years and was receiving the exemption prior to death.

The exemption may be continued or reinstated for the un-remarried spouse of a member who accrued at least 20 years of active service and was receiving the exemption prior to death. The exemption may be granted only to applicants who reside in the Village or Town served by the Orchard park Fire District.

The exemption is only available for the applicant's primary residence and only for property exclusively used for residential purposes.

The District shall compile a list of the eligible members and submit it to the local assessor by the taxable statue date.

On the motion by Commissioner Mrugalski and seconded by Commissioner Benning the motion to authorize the exemption for property tax is hereby approved subject to a public hearing posted in the District's official newspaper scheduled for the next regular meeting of the Orchard Park Fire District on March 12, 2024 at 7:00pm at 4222 South Taylor Road, Orchard Park, NY
